Cultivating Community: A Partnership Rooted in Care

Sanctuary One & the Teresa McCormick Center Grow Nourishment and Connection Together

When two organizations share a vision for community well-being, powerful things can grow—sometimes quite literally.

Our partnership with the Teresa McCormick Center in Medford is a powerful example of Earth Care becoming people care. This spring, our Earth Care Director, Jess, worked with Teresa McCormick Center to gather feedback from their food pantry participants, shaping what we planted. As a result, our fresh produce now reaches local families within 48 hours of harvest.

Last year, Jess led Sanctuary One care farm in producing and donating nearly 1,000 pounds of produce—valued at over \$3,000—to local food pantries. This year, with Teresa McCormick Center's support, we aim to surpass that impact.

Again, partnerships like this help us extend healing far beyond our fence line. Together, we're not just growing food—we're growing a stronger, more connected community.
